The Democratic Caucus' National Security Task Force, which Panetta co-chairs, sent Trump a <u>letter</u> urging the President to implement a strategy that uses economic pressure, firm diplomacy, and deterrence to address this national security challenge. 2. Co-sponsored <u>H.R. 669</u> <b>(1/2) Sen. Feinstein:</b> 1. Stated that US should have high level dialog with North Korea, <b>but no assertion of constitutional authority.</b> 2. Co-sponsored <u>S. 200</u> <b>(0/1) Sen. Harris:</b> 1. <i>Information not obtained on Harris actions on asserting war.</i> 2. <b>Not currently a co-sponsor of S. 200</b>

<p><b>Hurricane Maria</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Committed to passing aid package before October recess.</li> <li>Support amending <u>Jones Act</u> to not apply to areas receiving federal disaster aid</li> </ol>	<p><b>(2/2) Rep. Panetta:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><u>Called</u> for a better military response to Hurricane Maria and voted for aid package before the deadline.</li> <li>Rep. Panetta’s office reported that he would advocate for the Jones Act to be amended to exclude areas receiving federal disaster aid.</li> </ol> <p><b>(0/1) Sen. Feinstein:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><u>Joined 37 senators</u> in issuing letter to Trump calling for actions to be undertaken in Puerto Rico, <b>but the aid package was not passed before the deadline.</b></li> <li><i>Information not obtained on her position on the Jones Act.</i></li> </ol> <p><b>(0/2) Sen. Harris:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>She <u>urged</u> the Dept of Energy (DOE) to help Puerto Rico restore power and made other efforts towards helping Puerto Rico, <b>but the aid package was not passed before the deadline.</b></li> <li>Supported waiving Jones act, <b>but no official support of permanent amendment.</b></li> </ol>
<p><b>DACA</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Co-sponsor the bipartisan <u>DREAM Act</u> (S. 1615/H.R. 3440)</li> </ol>	<p><b>(1/1) Rep. Panetta:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Co-sponsored DREAM Act</li> </ol> <p><b>(1/1) Sen. Feinstein:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Co-sponsored <u>DREAM Act</u></li> </ol> <p><b>(1/1) Sen. Feinstein:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Opposes silencer provision of SHARE Act</li> </ol> <p><b>(0/1) Sen. Harris:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><u>Joined with Feinstein</u> on gun bill, <b>but no comments about the silencer provision</b></li> </ol>
<p><b>Iran Nuclear Deal</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Commit not to reimpose sanctions that would kill the deal and risk war with Iran</li> </ol>	<p><b>(1/1) Rep. Panetta:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><u>Stated</u> that Trump’s “decision not to certify the Iran deal is dangerous, isolates US, alienates allies and cedes our leadership role in the world”</li> </ol> <p><b>(1/1) Sen. Feinstein:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Urged Congress to vote against reimposing sanctions as long as Iran is upholding its side of the agreement</li> </ol> <p><b>(1/1) Sen. Harris:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Her office commented that unless Iran violates the JCPOA, we should continue to adhere to the agreement.</li> </ol>
<p><b>Budget and Taxes</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Oppose any legislation that cuts taxes for the wealthy and corporations paid for by taking away</li> </ol>	<p><b>(2/2) Rep. Panetta:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Stated that he “cannot support any budget that harms hardworking American families, rural communities, students, patients, agriculture industries, protected federal lands, and our environment” (3/16/17)</li> <li><u>Voted</u> not to pass the Trump Tax Scam.</li> </ol> <p><b>(2/2) Sen. Feinstein:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><u>Opposed tax plan that cuts taxes for rich at the expense of everyone else.</u></li> <li>Will vote against the Tax Scam.</li> </ol>

<p>Medicaid, Medicare, and other basics—or that just loses revenue.</p> <p>2. Vote against the tax bill.</p>	<p><b>(2/2) Sen. Harris:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. “As we enter into a national debate about tax reform, I will use my position as your senator to ensure that our tax policy helps lessen income inequality, rather than contributing to it. This means supporting investments in American families, communities, and businesses, all while ensuring corporations and the wealthiest Americans pay their fair share.”</li> <li>2. Will vote against the Tax Scam.</li> </ol>
<p><b>Clean Power Act</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Support the <u>Clean Power Plan</u></li> </ol>	<p><b>(1/1) Rep. Panetta:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <u>Released statement</u> against Trump’s decision to withdraw from the Clean Power Plan</li> </ol> <p><b>(1/1) Sen. Feinstein:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <u>Called on EPA admin Pruitt</u> to reconsider decision to repeal Clean Power Plan (press release 10/12/17)</li> </ol> <p><b>(1/1) Sen. Harris:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <u>Petitioned</u> Congress to continue funding the Clean Power Plan.</li> </ol>
<p><b>Q3 Town Halls</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. MoCs must hold regular Town Halls during recesses</li> </ol>	<p><b>(1/1) Rep. Panetta:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Held 2 town halls (one in Monterey and one in Hollister) and participated in a community dialogue about Obamacare at CSUMB in Q3</li> </ol> <p><b>(0/1) Sen. Feinstein:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>No Q3 town halls were held.</b></li> </ol> <p><b>(1/1) Sen. Harris:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Held <u>town hall in Oakland</u> 8/31/17 where 500 people attended</li> </ol>
